A short impression of what we do:

How many people do we want to host on the properties, how will the landscape look like, and what materials do we need? Where does our water and electricity come from, what activities would be great and what are the consequences for example in the field of safety? The team I work with is international. My main colleague is an experienced missionary from New-Zealand. It is a privilege to learn from him. We are delighted to have some great local colleagues who definitely help us to make it a 'real' Cambodian place.

"My 'average' day starts with a ride on the motor to a company providing waste water treatment, than arrive at the office for an air-con'd cool-down and crack my head over the just arrived drawings for the buildings. The work is diverse. I love it!"

Talitha: I work at the office two mornings a week. My role is to mentor Indian leaders and coordinators who go through an online Leadership Academy in order to train other 'Alongsiders' in India. Besides that I assist with administration, medical advise for the team and helping to work out the vision
