Besides the first building that will house about 120 people for sleeping we're

also working on finalising the design for a second building. This building will be a meeting place, an auditorium, a restaurant, kitchen and offices.

Multifunctional. We hope to start the building of this building soon.

Last couple of weeks we have had a New-Zeeland couple here who helped to sort out a lot of activities that we could do at the land. We are thankful that they offered their experience. This month we will also say goodbye to Dave and his wife Dawn who will transition back to New-Zeeland. Mart-Jan will take on Dave's role in a different form.

Back to the Jewish people and another good Jewish doing. When the people would meet each other they would greet each other with the word 'Shalom'.

Peace. That is what we would like to wish you as well. Peace in your life and heart. Peace with God and man.
